

Trustee's Scavenger Hunt

Serving in September
(different ways to participate)

Scavenger Hunt #1 Distribute a brief flyer to your neighbors explaining who(Avon UMC and why (September Service) are collecting for Light and Life Food Pantry and when you will do a porch pick up. Their need are for things they can pair up together and they recommended the following. (1) Peanut butter and jelly and sandwich loaf bread. Seems perfect for us because we are the PB and J church. (2) pack of one or two toothbrushes (not multi, because they can't open them to distribute) toothpaste and mouthwash, (3) spaghetti and spaghetti sauces (with/ without meat) (4) Tuna Helper with a can of tuna. All jars must be plastic. NO GLASS, PLEASE! Take items to church on Sunday, September 12th for me to pick up. Please box up and label with your name and my name as pick up person. Put them in Narthex coat closet. Include the point total you came up with. You could also bring to Trustee meeting on the 14th.

Scavenger Hunt #2 go to store with family and purchase items to be donated. Use the point values to try to come as close as possible to your desired number of total points. Suggested number is 1000 points. Work out your list ahead of time.

Scavenger Hunt #3 Call family, friends and work associates and ask them to donate to the Food Pantry. Include the point total you came up with.

Finally, I would like to suggest each trustee donate a family game that could be played by a family in their home. These would be distributed through Light and Life as they have come to know families. Games like Uno, Sorry, Monopoly, Checkers, Battleship, etc.

Point Values:

Tuna, 25 Tuna Helper 20

Family size Spaghetti 15 Small box 5 Spaghetti Sauce Large 25 Small 15

Toothbrush 10 pts each. Toothpaste 20 Mouthwash 25

Peanut Butter Lg. 40 Small 20 Jelly. Large 50 Small 30 Sandwich Loaf 75

For example, you could do 4 cans of tuna, 4 tuna helper, 4 large PB and 4 large jelly and 4 loaves of bread for 840 points. What else could you get to make it to 1,000 points?

I have also included a list of items that are needed by Dayspring. PZ Sinclair is leading that project and you could bring items to our meeting. Finally, Rotary is accepting shoes in good condition and Ryan Sinclair with Finance is doing that project. I can see that he gets them if you also bring to our September meeting.
